Landscape: We have had a few more "drive-overs" on the lawn areas on 207th, one side came within inches of the fence and went almost the entire length of the white fence, it happened again last night.

Landscape committee thinks that we need to do something about this as it keeps happening. Robyn has a bid from Dad's landscaping to cut the lawn out 2 ft. back from the road, install cobble rock and 2 man rocks the entire length of the entry way, it will be similar to the 202nd entry. Kirt will check the budget for funding.

Landscape Committee is scheduled to meet March 18th at the home of Robyn Welch to discuss spring flower selection and planting, and any other projects.

Maintenance: Paul Welch from the Maintenance committee gave a report regarding the Monuments. There has been vandalism at all of the entryway monuments that is breaking the lighting system. He is recommending a mesh cover to protect the holes. The Committee will look into getting bids and more ideas from contractors.
