DID YOU KNOW...

Keeping the gravel ditch and road shoulder weed-free not only looks great but acts as a natural fire barrier from our parched landscaping by preventing the hot vehicle muffler or discarded cigarette from finding a fuel source. Protect yourself and your neighbors.

Those small blue reflective squares glued to the road centerline are markers for fire hydrants. The fire department or you can easily find a hydrant by looking for the reflectors and checking the roadside immediately on either side. The time saved may save lives.

When, not if it rains again, those beautifully painted rain gutters will probably be useless until cleaned of the needles and seed pods collecting for the past three dry months. If you plan to have them cleaned professionally (preferred) or a do-it-yourself project, disconnect the down spouts before starting. The entire drainage system is fed via buried pipes to a cistern that will eventually fill with debris and not carry the water away from the foundation as it was designed. Nice to know stuff.
